Our location

Bayview Secondary College is located on the Eastern Shore of Hobart in the area that has historically been known as Clarence Plains. The college services families from Seven-Mile Beach, South Arm, Cremorne, Sandford, Clarendon Vale, Rokeby, Lauderdale, Oakdown Estate, Glebe Hill, Acton and Clifton Beach. Small by design, with an enrolment of around 300 students, and specialists by nature, Bayview Secondary College is a centre of innovation and a community hub. Students in our college are supported by the best possible facilities and resources.

Our facilities

Our college has a range of high quality facilities for students. Through our purpose built senior college classrooms and a performing arts centre, the grade 7 Student Learning Centre (SLC) and our new STEAM hub, we provide state of the art working spaces for our students, facilitating innovative teaching and learning methods in a spacious and modern setting. Our facilities are set for further upgrades in the years to come.

We have a new fitness and athlete development centre, a large gymnasium, and a wide variety of sports fields, which allow every student to experience a wide range of different sports and activities.

Our Foods and Textiles space includes the a community cafe which is open to the community for lunch and catering enterprises. The Materials, Design & Technology workshop has state of the art equipment for students to develop their skills and produce high quality designs for sale through its enterprise and entrepreneurial pursuits.

Our Art and Music departments are busy and productive places, and have a long history of producing outstanding artists achieving state-wide recognition. Our industry standard Dance and Performing Arts Centre is in high demand, attracting quality performers and mentors who work with students regularly.

Our new Senior Secondary hub was recently completed and this includes a functional hairdressing salon, practical nursing centre, and several large and comfortable learning spaces for our 11/12 students.



Our core curriculum

It is important for young people to gain a good understanding of all subject disciplines in order to make informed choices for their future. We place emphasis on developing the literacy, numeracy and general capabilities that are required for every learning area, therefore all teachers at our college are highly skilled literacy and numeracy teachers.

Our college week consists of classes in compulsory Australian Curriculum subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Health and Physical Education, Civics and Citizenship; and in our options program, which includes academic extension subjects, vocational enterprise, sports training, performing and visual arts and flexible and personalised learning.

Our supportive college community

Our college is structured around teams and networks for the personal care of students. This includes Grade Coordinators, Junior and Senior College Managers, a College Psychologist and Social Worker, College nurse, Home Group Teachers, Support Teachers, Teacher Assistants and Specialist Teachers.

Every student has a team of dedicated teachers and support staff who will work with them as they progress through secondary college, to support each child's changing needs and provide them with a personalised learning experience. In Grade 7, we focus on harmony, building the personal skills and relationships necessary to get along and settle into our college. Grade 8 is about personal growth and building confidence, while years 9 and 10 see students develop pathway plans and undertake rich learning experiences inside and outside the classroom as they move towards career and lifelong learning goals.

College leadership and citizenship

Part of belonging to a great college is about having a say. In our college, students have a voice through their Year 10 Prefect Executive and also through Student Representative Council as class representatives. Leadership skills are developed through opportunities such as our student driven Diversity and Anti-bullying teams, Aussie Sports Leaders, House Captains, Team Captains, and Student Forums. Our students have a strong voice at Bayview Secondary College and we listen to their needs and suggestions for making the college a better place.

Our students are strongly encouraged to be positively involved in the wider community through activities such as: council led YNAG, organising fundraising events for student selected charities, supporting a zero tolerance to any type of harassment and bullying through values of inclusion, acceptance of diversity and tolerance, and by making a difference as local and global citizens. We encourage students in all grades to think about their place in the world and to understand that their positive actions can make a difference to the lives and well-being of others.

Our extra-curricular programs

At Bayview Secondary College we specialise in providing extra-curricular learning opportunities for our students that support learning outcomes in the general capabilities of the Australian Curriculum and provide students with an engaging and vibrant educational experience.

We encourage all students to participate in extra-curricular activities: to build life experience, develop character, reinforce people skills, enhance personal confidence and promote positive self-esteem. College camps, outdoor education, sports teams and athlete development, performing arts, surf survival, community participation and mainland trips are prominent features of our college program.

Our Junior School

The Grade 7 team provide a smooth and supportive transition from primary school. The classes work in a secure and structured environment with a curriculum emphasising the development of literacy and numeracy skills. A core focus is harmony, so that students of different schools come together positively, and form new friendships to see them through six years of secondary college.

The Grade 7 cohort are based in the new Student Learning Centre (SLC) which is a modern, state of the art facility. Each Grade 7 class works with one or two core teachers in their own classroom space, which assists in relationship building, focussed pastoral care and inclusive personalised learning plans.

Grade 8 students are also part of our Junior School, and spend their core teaching time with two or three core teachers. They have the opportunity to participate in our options program along with senior students. This is an opportunity to expand their relationships, and for a focussed and targeted core learning program leading into the senior years.

Our Senior School

Grades 9 and 10 make up the Senior School at Bayview Secondary College. They are located in a purpose built teaching and learning space, and work closely with their core teachers to achieve academic excellence and personal growth. There is an emphasis on pastoral care and individualised learning to ensure all learning styles are recognised and supported. Students are encouraged to participate in opportunities linked with community and business partners such as work and industry placements.

In addition to core subjects, students choose a number of options subjects which provide real world opportunities to extend their personal skills through entrepreneurial, creative and personalised activities, for example; attending Outdoor Education camps or elite fitness training through the Bayview Sports - high performance program, achieving Barista or RSA hospitality standard qualifications, working with industry specialists through an MDT partnership, or working as Child and Family Centre volunteers.

Senior Secondary

Bayview Secondary College's (BSC) 11/12 program aims to deliver quality, innovative and diverse educational programs in a supportive environment to assist students as they progress towards their personal goals. Students enrolled at BSC are provided with opportunities to achieve their Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE) or pursue a vocational pathway through one of our specialised vocational education and training courses (VET).

Currently BCS offers a variety of Tasmanian Assessment, Standards and Certification (TASC) courses from the areas of English, Mathematics, Physical Education and Health. BSC currently offer a number unique specialist VET courses in the areas of Salon Assistant, Health Services Assistance, Creative Industries and Dance. In the future BSC will be looking to expand on its offering of both TASC and VET courses to include specialist training in the areas of Fitness, Construction, Sport and Recreation.

BSC's 11/12 area is located within a purpose built area of the school where students have access to vibrant and flexible learning spaces containing a variety of 21st century learning resources. Our 11/12 area also consists of purpose built industry standard salon and hospital training facilities for the delivery of our VET courses. Students may elect to enrol at both Bayview Secondary and Rosny College as a dual enrolment.

Sport

Our college has a proud sporting culture and we offer a wide range of sporting activities and carnivals. Students are able to participate in school sports exchanges and after school and daytime sports rosters. Students participate in sports such as Netball, Football, Cricket, Swimming, Touch Football, Soccer, Futsal, Basketball, Badminton, Table Tennis and Surfing. Our Outdoor Education class enjoy a variety of extended options, e.g. bike riding, camping, rafting, rock climbing, and kayaking.

Athletic, Swimming and Cross Country teams representing Bayview Secondary College compete in inter-school carnivals. School teams are established for special events such as Mud Runs and Charity Runs. Many of our students participate in individual sports, such as horse riding, or competitive boxing. We have a new fitness and athlete development centre which enables students to work towards competition at the highest level. Our representation at State and National level in sport has been exceptional throughout our proud history and we have many sporting ambassadors who regularly support our students through motivational speeches, workshops, and fitness training.





Bayview Sports High Performance Centre

The Bayview Sports - High Performance Centre has been established to assist talented student athletes to achieve at the highest levels of performance in their chosen sport; and to help them with their personal, educational and vocational development. The program has established key partnerships between the College, Department of Education, and sporting clubs and organisations in the aim of providing a multidimensional education with academic and sporting development the priority.

The aims of the Bayview Sports - High Performance Centre is to provide student athletes access to:

- A flexible, supportive and "athlete friendly" academic environment. The academic program covers essential learning in English, Mathematics, Humanities, Science, Health and Physical Education, Technology and Arts.
- Quality coaching and mentoring in our state of the art fitness centre and multimedia facilities.
- Specialised sports subjects such as Athlete Development, Personal Health and Fitness, Sport Science, Sports Leadership, and Project Management.
- Access to our state of the art fitness centre before/during/after school.

STEAM and Digital Technologies

What is STEAM? STEAM is a teaching method that combines the learning areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics to promote real-life learning with innovative applications in a students' world. By combining science and the arts, students become more creative, scientifically literate, ethically astute, and prepared for the future workforce. Research studies show that the future workforce will require employees to have a diverse skill set with employers showing preference to those with experience in STEAM projects and concepts. Furthermore, our approach ensures that all students from varying learning abilities and interests are catered for in STEAM programs which promote happy, positive and engaged learners.

A fully integrated approach to technology, and adoption of STEAM education means our students have more career options and are provided with evolving inspiration to continue as life-long learners. Our unique STEAM program integrates connections with industry, emerging pedagogies, and exclusive partnerships such as with North Melbourne Football Club, LiveTiles, Beacon, the University of Tasmania (UTAS), the Institute of Marine and Antarctic Sciences (IMAS), Journey VR, PRISM Media House, and Clarence City Council.

In grades 7 and 8 students develop foundation skills including inquiry skills, creative design thinking, and new technologies such as 3D printing, laser cutting, and coding. In grades 9 and 10 students consolidate and further develop these skills through student directed inquiry and commence engagement with relevant industry bodies, specific to their projects.

Our teachers have been involved in leading STEAM pedagogical programs on a state and national level. This involved the development of learning materials with North Melbourne Football Club and Beacon, the Department of Education Tasmania, and collaboration with interstate schools.

Personalised and flexible learning

Students at Bayview Secondary College have the opportunity to participate in a personalised curriculum that is tailored to their own needs and interests, as well as undertaking a core curriculum that is centred on the knowledge, skills, capabilities and conceptual understandings outlined in the Australian Curriculum. Students are supported to develop their own personalised learning plans, designed to assist them with their pathway to college or further vocational training.

At Bayview Secondary College we believe that students learn best in a supportive, engaging and personalised environment. This means that the best learning space for every student is not always within the four walls of the classroom.

Depending on personal circumstances, goals and specific needs, it may be that students learn best from home, through study online, at alternative learning sites, through work placements and college based apprenticeships, or perhaps through a combination of all of these!

Starting in 2018, we will focus our Grade 9/10 program towards Industry Pathway Planning, working closely with our Collective Education team around further education and employment.

Our 7/8's will also share the direction of further education by focussing on achieving required literacy and numeracy levels across the college and for the workforce.

Creative and Performing Arts

The Creative and Performing Arts are a strong part of college life at Bayview Secondary College. Our Music department has been a state-wide leader in contemporary rock music for over a decade, and our Dance program is a state leader in contemporary dance, bringing national superstars such as *Timomatic*, *Lamb*, and *Justice Crew* to the state to work with our students on major dance projects each year. Students regularly perform at assemblies and community events, as well as creating their own collaborative projects and shows.

Our Visual Arts program produces work of outstanding quality, with a showcase and exhibition each year, and our annual Arts Evening provides students with the opportunity to be part of either the planning crew, to showcase their work or perform at the event.

The teggana Collective

Our teggana partnership with Rosny College provide a strong network of support for our Grade 10 students as they transition into the College sector. Our retention rates into year 11 and 12 are excellent. Many of our students achieve significant levels of excellence throughout their studies as they continue through at Bayview, attend Rosny College other teggana campuses. Our Hall of Fame celebrates high achieving students across a wide range of vocational and academic pursuits.

Our students in year 9 and 10 further benefit from the opportunity to participate in many transition activities including University programs, Taste of TAFE and Trade events, as well as work experience and work studies programs to support their individual pathway plans.

My Education

My Education is a coordinated whole-school approach to career and life planning. It is a partnership between the student, parents and carers, the college and the community, and also aims to engage with business and industry in Tasmania by linking education with a student's future employment options.

Bayview staff activate their lived experiences to engage and support students to identify their personal interests, values, strengths and aspirations, and teach them how to use this knowledge to make decisions about their future learning, work and life opportunities. The program is delivered as part of pastoral care / home group for each grade and supplemented with guest speakers, assemblies, themed days and industry partners, who visit the college to tell their story and importantly, share their career pathway.

Middle years literacy project

The Middle Years Literacy Project commenced in 2017 and initially involved 18 schools across four associations in Tasmania.

In 2018, a further eight associations made up of 38 schools have joined the project and Bayview Secondary College is thrilled to be working alongside the four feeder primary schools in our area to make up the Bayview Association.

In our context, the three-year project aims to enhance student writing outcomes by ensuring a common approach to explicitly teaching literacy skills at Lauderdale Primary School, South Arm Primary School, Rokeby Primary School, Clarendon Vale Primary School and Bayview Secondary College.

Teachers from the five schools will collaborate as a professional learning community to share knowledge, enhance teacher practice and encourage students to develop a specific skillset and key understandings that will ensure they make a smooth transition from Year 6 at their local primary school to Year 7 at Bayview Secondary College.

Stu Warren, formerly the senior school manager at Bayview, will co-ordinate the project and work with staff across the five schools to facilitate targeted professional development and track student outcomes over the course of the project.

The project intends to deliver improvements in student writing as well as ensuring the best possible transition for students between Year 6 and Year 7, which is often a challenging step to take given the potential for different approaches to classroom learning that can exist between primary and secondary schools.

Participation in the Middle Years Learning Project is another example of Bayview's commitment to excellence in teaching and learning and illustrates our focus on producing the best possible outcomes for all students.

Positive Education

Student resilience and wellbeing are essential for both academic and social development, and are optimized by safe, supportive and respectful learning environments. Schools share this responsibility with the whole community.

Not only do confident and resilient children with a capacity for emotional intelligence perform better academically, these skills can also contribute to their ability to create strong social bonds and supportive communities, and to maintain healthy relationships and responsible lifestyles.

At Bayview Secondary College we understand that the best learning happens when students are resilient, happy and confident. For maximum striving, thriving and flourishing wellbeing, our students are taught positive ways of thinking about themselves and their learning, so that they can act in ways that will make them more successful. A growth mindset is an important disposition for any learner and our student well-being program assists students to develop this as they move from year 7 to 12.
